

Guidelines for Abstract Submission

We invite participants to present their work and submit abstracts for the WCRC-6 and ICGI 2016 Conferences. Please follow these Abstract Submission Guidelines carefully as this will insure that your submission is successful and that your abstract will be considered.

All accepted abstracts will be published in the Conference Book of Abstracts that will be distributed upon registration at the Conference venue.

Abstract submission

Abstracts must be submitted electronically only through the dedicated Abstract Submission Form of the WCRC-6/ICGI 2016 website. Abstracts submitted by other means (email, fax...) will not be considered.

Only abstracts submitted by a fully registered Presenting Author will be accepted. A registered participant may submit up to 2 abstracts as Presenting Author. Abstracts may be submitted by the Presenting Author at the time of registration, and up to the abstract submission deadline (March 31st, 2016). Abstracts submitted at the time of registration will be considered only once full payment of the registration fee is confirmed. The Presenting Author will be notified of successful submission.

During the process of submission, the Presenting Author will indicate the preferred mode of presentation (oral or poster presentation).

Please review carefully your abstract before submitting it. Abstracts will not be edited nor corrected, and are of the submitting author's full responsibility.

Submission deadline

The deadline for Abstract submission is March 31st, 2016. Past this date, abstracts will no longer be accepted. The presenting author will be notified of acceptance and of the type of presentation (oral or poster) by April 11th, 2016.

Guidelines for oral and poster presentations will be available on the Conference website in due time.

General guidelines

Abstracts are to be submitted in English, using either the British or the US grammatical rules. Units should follow the International System of Units, or internationally-recognized commonly used units. Please avoid units used locally. Names of genus and species should be italicized. Abstracts should be self-explicative, please avoid terms such as "Results will be discussed..." or "Work is in progress...".

The submitted abstract should include the following information that should be completed in the appropriate boxes of the Abstract Submission Form: Title, Authors, Authors' Affiliations and Addresses, Key Words (maximum of 5), Abstract Text, References (maximum of 5), and Acknowledgments. The Abstract text should not exceed 500 words. Please do not include figures or tables.

The text may be typed directly in the appropriate boxes of the Abstract Submission Form, or may be pasted from a MS Word (.doc or .docx) document. The use of other text editing programs may result in configuration problems. When pasting text into the appropriate boxes of the Abstract Submission Form, please review carefully the text before submitting it since configuration problems may occur, in particular when using symbols or special styles (italics, bold...). The special character insertion tool of the form can be used to insert special characters, symbols, or font style.
